*The Story of an African Farm* details the lives of three characters, first as children and then as adults - Waldo, Em and Lyndall - who live on a farm in the Karoo region of South Africa. Set in the middle- to late nineteenth century, the novel is semi-autobiographical: in particular, the two principal protagonists display strong similarities to Schreiner's life and philosophy. The book was first published in 1883 in London, under the pseudonym

Ralph Iron. It quickly became a best-seller, despite causing some controversy over its frank portrayal of free thought, feminism, premarital sex and pregnancy out of wedlock, and transvestitism. (*Wikipedia*)
